

Oklahoma continues to be recognized globally for its outstanding business location and job growth incentives. Businesses can choose between two incentive options for new companies, or in some cases, qualifying businesses can receive both incentives.



QUALITY JOBS 10-Year Cash Incentive

Oklahoma's successful Quality Jobs incentive program promotes job growth and helps improve your company's bottom line by injecting cash back into your business as you expand and create new jobs in Oklahoma. The Quality Jobs (QJ) program provides a cash rebate to companies that create well-paid jobs and promote economic development.

- Cash payments of **up to** 5% of new payroll for **up to** 10 years
- Must meet average county wage or \$29,745, whichever is lower
- Company must achieve \$2.5M annual payroll within 3 years
- Must offer basic health insurance
- May be combined with Investment/New Jobs Tax Credit under certain circumstances

Target Industries:
Manufacturing, including wind power manufacturing, R&D corporate services, aerospace and data centers.

INVESTMENT / NEW JOBS Tax Credit Package



Investment/New Jobs Tax Credits provide growing manufacturers a significant tax credit based on either an investment in depreciable property OR on the addition of full-time-equivalent employees engaged in manufacturing, processing, or aircraft maintenance.

- Choice of tax credit based on investment OR new employees
- Five-year state tax credit on the greater of 1% per year of investment in new depreciable property or \$500 per new employee
- Credit doubles in Enterprise Zones
- Credit doubles if investment exceeds \$40 million
- Minimum investment of \$50,000
- May be combined with Quality Jobs under certain circumstances
- These tax credits accrue and may be claimed on July 1, 2012

21st CENTURY QUALITY JOBS 10-Year Cash Incentive

This new incentive was created in 2009 to attract growth industries and sectors to Oklahoma in the 21st Century through a policy of rewarding businesses with a highly skilled, knowledge-based workforce.

The first of its kind, this incentive reduces out-of-state sales requirements from 75% to 50% for industries that are required to have out-of-state sales and requires only 10 full-time jobs at an annual wage of the lesser of \$93,601 or 300% of the county's average wage. It also maximizes the eligible incentive payment by incorporating expanded state benefits by allowing a net benefit rate of up to 10% of payroll.

- Requires at least 10 full-time jobs at an annual average wage of the lesser of \$93,601 or 300% of the county's average wage
- Allows a net benefit rate of up to 10% of payroll for up to 10 years
- Out-of-state sales must be at least 50%

Target Industries:

Knowledge-based service industries, including professional, scientific and technical services; music, film and performing arts; and specialty hospitals.

PRIMEWIN

Prime Contractor Incentive

The only incentive of its kind in the nation, PrimeWIN provides a cash benefit and a certified subcontractor base for federal prime contractors. PrimeWIN is a performance-based program that requires subcontracting with an Oklahoma workforce.

- PrimeWIN offers federal prime contractors a cash rebate of up to 2% of the Oklahoma workforce loaded labor cost. Cash incentives are paid quarterly for a maximum of 10 years by the Oklahoma Tax Commission.
- PrimeWIN provides contractors with an easy-to-access conduit to hundreds of pre-certified subcontractors assuring productivity and quality while meeting schedule demands.

QUALITY JOBS + INVESTMENT TAX CREDITS

These incentives target manufacturing industries that have a large capital investment of at least \$40 million in addition to creating new jobs that pay higher than average wages equaling \$37,775. The incentives also allow a five-year tax credit on the greater of 2% per year of investment in qualified new depreciable property or credit of \$1,000 per year per new job. The tax credits accrue and may be claimed on July 1, 2012.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT POOLED FINANCE

The Oklahoma Community Economic Development Pooled Finance incentive creates a financing incentive that targets job creation and infrastructure development aid; and a foundation of ensuring Oklahoma's infrastructure is high quality for attracting and retaining jobs.

Key Points:

- A \$100 million infrastructure Pool is created for bonding local governments for:
 - County/municipal roads & bridges
 - Water treatment facilities
 - Solid waste management facilities
 - Railway and utility systems
 - Other infrastructure assets owned by local government
- Bonds issued by the infrastructure pool are financed or repaid from sales taxes voted by local community.
- A \$100 million Economic Development Pool is created for financing to local governments in conjunction with a for-profit entity economic development projects in the state.
- Debt issued through the Economic Development Pool may use withholding taxes generated by the for-profit entity to repay the debt.
- Requires a letter of determination from the Oklahoma Department of Commerce that the project is net benefit positive for the state.
- 65% of the net proceeds from both the Infrastructure Pool and the Economic Development Pool must be used by municipalities that do not exceed 300,000 people.
- The remaining 35% may be used for any eligible local government, including Tulsa and Oklahoma City.
- Effective July 1, 2009
- Issuing capacity by Oklahoma Development Finance Authority (ODFA) is renewable.

FORMER INDIAN LANDS Incentive and Tax Credit

Because of its unique Native American heritage, two-thirds of Oklahoma qualifies for special federal tax treatment.

Businesses locating or expanding in these areas benefit up to 40% federal accelerated depreciation and up to \$4,000 federal tax credit per qualifying employee.

New Market Tax Credits

To spur private investment in low-income urban and rural communities, investors receive a 39% federal tax credit.

Sales Tax Refunds on Construction Materials

For Qualifying Manufacturers (with Investment Tax Credit only)

Training for Industry Program

Consistently ranked as one of the nation's leading workforce training efforts, Oklahoma's Training for Industry Program (TIP), a CareerTech initiative, is a no-cost/low-cost way for new or growing companies that create jobs to get a skilled, focused, and motivated workforce.

Aerospace Industry Engineer Workforce Tax Credit

Effective July 1, 2012, aerospace companies hiring engineers will receive tax credit up to 10% of the compensation paid to an engineer during the first five years of employment.

Five-Year Ad Valorem Tax Exemption

To encourage advanced manufacturing, research and development, warehouse and distribution, wind, solar energy, and other renewable/alternative energy companies to locate or expand manufacturing facilities within Oklahoma. A qualifying manufacturing company can abate ad valorem taxes upon new, expanded or acquired manufacturing facilities and equipment for a period of five years.

Freeport Inventory Benefits

Exempts from taxation goods, wares and merchandise that come from outside the state and leave the state within nine months if such goods, wares and merchandise are held for assembly, storage, manufacturing, processing or fabricating purposes within the state.

Industrial Access Road Assistance

Designed to provide assistance to local industrial development efforts by funding, within practical limitations, access facilities connecting a specific industry or industrial area directly to the state or local road system.

Foreign Trade Zones

The benefits of operating within a designated site licensed by the Foreign Trade Zones (FTZ) Board are obvious. At the very least, a FTZ can help you defer paying duties. More often, the company pays lower costs, not only to U.S. Customs, but to its bank, insurance company, and other vendors.

ADDITIONAL INCENTIVES AVAILABLE TO COMMUNITIES for Locating and Expanding Businesses

Economic Development Pooled Finance

Available to local governments in conjunction with a for-profit entity for economic development projects. Also available to local governments for infrastructure assets which must be owned by the local government.

CDBG/EDIF

Grants of up to \$500,000 are available to Oklahoma companies for business expansion, or up to \$1 million for new out-of-state companies who are moving their business to Oklahoma and based upon new jobs and leverage. Companies must pay at least 110% of average county wage for all new jobs. At least 51% of the new jobs must be made available to low and moderate income persons.

ABSTRACT

This paper provides a comprehensive overview of the economic conditions of McLoud, Shawnee and Tecumseh and Pottawatomie County. The information provided includes the trends in population, employment, income, and retail sales.

A Summary of Economic Conditions in McLoud, Shawnee, Tecumseh and Pottawatomie County, Oklahoma 2011

The economy of Pottawatomie County greatly depends on the government and the government enterprises sector. Nearly 18% of the jobs in Pottawatomie in 2008 were jobs within the government and governmental enterprises sector. Retail trade, manufacturing and construction are also important sectors to Pottawatomie County. This report is designed to provide an overview of the economic conditions of McLoud, Shawnee, Tecumseh and Pottawatomie County; but more specifically, its objective is to examine trends in population, employment, income, and retail sales. **No recommendations will be made regarding the findings of this report.**

General Demographic and Population Data

According to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce (OKDoC), the 2009 population for McLoud, Shawnee and Tecumseh is 4,609, 30,536 and 6,721 respectively. This is a 29.9%, 6.4% and 10.2% increase from 2000 respectively (Table 1). During the same time period, Pottawatomie County's population increased 7.3% from 65,521 to 70,274.

The figures in Table 2 show the total housing units and the average size of households in Pottawatomie County and McLoud, Shawnee and Tecumseh in 2009. Pottawatomie County had 26,236 housing units and an average of 2.66 persons per household. Of the housing units in the county, 44.5% were in Shawnee, and 9% were located in Tecumseh.

Table 3 reports educational attainment data for McLoud, Shawnee and Tecumseh and Pottawatomie County. McLoud, Shawnee and Tecumseh report 34.5%, 46.9% and 35.6% of the population aged 25 and over to be high school graduates. The

county reports 37.6% of those 25 and over to be high school graduates. The percentage of the population over 25 with a high school diploma in Oklahoma was 32.9%. In terms of the proportion of the population over 25 with a bachelor's degree, McLoud, Shawnee and Tecumseh had 5.7%, 12.5% and 10.7%, respectively; 15% of the population over 25 with a bachelor's degree in Oklahoma.

Figure 1 shows the population growth for residents aged 19 and under and for the 65 and over age group in the county. From 2000 to 2008, Pottawatomie County's youth population has increased by 0.5%. During the same time period, the number of residents age 65 and older increased by 9.7% for Pottawatomie County.



Employment Trends

Table 4 shows Pottawatomie County's employment numbers provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, from 1990-2009. (Also see Figure 2.) Employment in the county has increased slightly from 29,237 in 2000 to 31,876 in 2009. The county had its highest unemployment rate in 1991 at 7%. Its lowest rate was 3.2% in 2000. The unemployment rate in Pottawatomie County decreased from 2003 until 2008, from 5.9% to 3.8% in 2008, but it sharply rose to 6.3% in 2009. As one can see in figure 3, Pottawatomie County's unemployment rate is higher than Oklahoma's, though the gap has narrowed significantly in recent years.

Table 5 provides information on employment by industry for the county from 2001-2008. During this period, Pottawatomie County's largest employers are state and local government, retail trade, and health care and social assistance. Total employment over this period increased, though slight job losses were observed in the following industries: information, transportation and warehousing, wholesale trade, manufacturing, and federal and state government. The greatest job growth occurred in the government and government enterprises (43.7 %) followed by the real estate and rental and leasing (37.5%).

Table 6 gives further analysis of the conditions in the county by using a location quotient to determine a community's degree of self-sufficiency in a particular economic sector. (Also see Figure 4.) The location quotient is used to identify exporting activity and is calculated by dividing the percentage of those locally employed in a particular sector by the percentage of those employed in the same sector nationwide.¹

The location quotient can be used to interpret whether a county is self-sufficient, is an importer, or is an exporter in a particular sector. A location quotient that is approximately one (0.75-1.25) suggests self-sufficiency; a quotient less than 0.75 suggest that a county is an importer. If the location quotient is greater than 1.25, the county likely exports products of that sector. The greater the location quotient, the more significant that sector is to the local economy.


According to Table 6, and Figure 4, Pottawatomie County is likely an exporter in farming, mining, utilities, educational services, accommodation and food services, and state and local government sectors in 2008. The county is probably an importer in the following sectors: forestry and fishing, mining, wholesale trade, transportation and warehousing, finance and insurance, real estate and rental, arts and entertainment, and federal civilian government. For clarification, (D) in Table 6 generally represents a situation where the number of employers is so small that employment numbers cannot be released without jeopardizing privacy constraints. They do not necessarily represent zero activity.





Income Trends

Table 7 provides data portraying total personal income by major source for Pottawatomie County from 2001-2008. Between 2001 and 2008, total personal income in Pottawatomie County increased by 45.12%. One source of income growth in the county during this period, was the growth of supplements to wages and salaries (i.e., benefits; 66.03%). Per capita income for the state of Oklahoma was \$35,969. Per capita income in Pottawatomie County was \$30,166 in 2008. (See also Figure 5). Some of the disparity in per capita income between Pottawatomie County and Oklahoma is likely due to the growing population of age 65 and above that face fixed incomes and the large share of employment in sectors that do not see wages rise as quickly as the other sectors (e.g., government).

It is also significant that Pottawatomie County's "adjustment for residence" has been positive and is currently positive. Thus, this income adjustment accounts for the fact that about one fourth of personal income is earned outside of Pottawatomie County.


Transfer payments are often referred to only as "welfare payments," but this category actually contains a much more diverse group of payments. Table 8 gives the breakdown of the various types of transfer payments received in the county from 2001-2008. From 2001-2008, other transfer payments to individuals increased by 865.6%, making it the fastest growing category. The next fastest growing category was medical benefits (150.5%). Categories of transfer payments that declined over this period: business payments to individuals (which are primarily personal injury payments).

Trends in Use and Sales Tax Collections

Tables 9-11 presents use tax collections for the City of McLoud, Shawnee and Tecumseh for fiscal years 2003-2009. Use tax is a tax paid on merchandise bought outside of Oklahoma when the tax was not charged in another state (Oklahoma Tax Commission). For fiscal year 2009, McLoud, Shawnee and Tecumseh had \$39,401, \$767, 672 and \$33,901 in use tax collections remitted to the cities respectively.

Table 12 presents county sales tax collections for Pottawatomie County for fiscal years 2003-2009. In 2009, collections totaled \$7,464, 972 (an increase of 50.4% since 2003), and the tax rate was 1%. Tables 13-15 show sales tax collections for the city of McLoud, Shawnee and Tecumseh from 1990-2009. In 2009, McLoud, Shawnee and Tecumseh collected \$450,956 (at 3.5%), \$15,946,576 (at 3%) and \$779,472 (at 3%) respectively.

Estimates of retail sales can be calculated from sales tax collection figures. Figures 6-8 show estimated retail sales for the city of McLoud, Shawnee and Tecumseh from 1990-2009. Retail sales growth can be an important indicator for communities to track over time. Not only are retail sales an indicator of the strength of an economy, but since most communities depend on municipal sales tax revenues to fund their budgets, retail sales also determine a local government's ability to provide for local services. Furthermore, careful analysis of retail strengths and weaknesses may indicate possible areas of improvement for communities intently focused on economic development through the retention or attraction of local retail dollars. Estimated retail sales in McLoud, Shawnee and Tecumseh increased between 2004 and 2009. Retail sales in McLoud rose dramatically in 1998, remained stable until 2004, and they have risen

consistently since; see Figure 6. As one can see in Figure 7, retail sales in Shawnee have increased steadily since 1980. Tecumseh's estimated retail sales didn't show a steady growth; rather they have hovered around \$25 million for the last decade, as illustrated in Figure 8. Retail sales growth is consistent with the increases in employment and income discussed in previous sections of this report.





Figure 6. Estimated Retail Sales for McLoud, OK, 1980-2009





Farms and Agriculture

The importance of agriculture may be frequently understated in discussions about total employment and personal income. Many jobs and salaries are generated in businesses that support agriculture. For example, a farm supply store would be classified as a retail establishment, but the methods of reporting data are such that it is difficult to isolate the agricultural businesses; however, specific agricultural data was collected to indicate the magnitude of agriculture in Pottawatomie County.

Table 16 contains farm income and expenditure data as reported by the Bureau of Economic Analysis, for the years 2001-2008. The volume of sales and expenditures reflects, to some extent, the relationship between agriculture and agri-related businesses. For Pottawatomie County, cash receipts and other income increased by 30.5% from 2001-2008, and production expenses also increased by 24.9%. The fact that income rose faster than expenses explains the increase in total farm and labor and proprietors income from 2001 to 2008. Figure 9 illustrates the total farm labor and proprietors' income for the county from 1991-2008.

Table 17 summarizes Census of Agriculture data for 1997, 2002, and 2007 for the county. In 2007, there were 1,777 farms in Pottawatomie County, and 395,056 total acres in farms. Approximately 78.4% of the land area in the county was farmland in 2007. Most of the farms (1,602 out of 1,777) were family or individually owned, and 725 of the farmers reported farming to be their principal occupation. The average age of farm operators in Pottawatomie County in 2007 was 58 years of age. The market value of agricultural products sold in the county during 2007 was \$35,054,000, or \$19,726 per farm.

ABSTRACT

The goal of this paper is to provide an analysis of taxable sales for the community of Shawnee and Pottawatomie County. Basic data is used to provide estimates of trade area capture and pull factors. Reported sales tax data is also used to analyze trends in the county and area.

ANALYSIS OF RETAIL TRENDS AND TAXABLE SALES FOR SHAWNEE AND POTAWATOMIE COUNTY, OKLAHOMA

INTRODUCTION

Oklahoma communities have been concerned with all aspects of economic development for the past several years. Creating new jobs and additional income is of concern to rural communities and urban areas alike. Often, retailing is viewed as a "service" sector dependent on the "basic" sectors such as oil, manufacturing, and agriculture. Export sectors produce goods and services sold outside the local or regional economy. Service sectors tend to circulate existing local dollars rather than attracting "new" outside dollars. The retail sector is important, though, as retail activity reflects the general health of a local economy. Retail sales also produce sales tax dollars that support municipal service provision. Many local communities are promoting a "shop at home" campaign to keep local retail dollars in the community. It will not be possible to stop all out-of-town spending or sales leakage for a local economy. Opportunities for improvement do frequently exist, however. Key areas can be identified for improvement. Analysis of retail trends can identify emerging trade centers. Local leaders in Shawnee requested the following taxable sales analysis. The specific objectives of the study are:

1. Utilize reported sales tax data to analyze trends in the county and area.
2. Provide estimates of trade area capture and market attraction.
3. Provide estimates of market attraction, broken out by SIC code.

METHODOLOGY AND DATA SOURCES

A trade area analysis model frequently used is "trade area capture." Trade area capture is calculated by dividing the city's retail sales by state per capita retail sales. The figure is adjusted by income differences between the state and relevant local area. The specific equation utilized is:

$$TAC_c = \frac{RS_c}{\frac{RS_s}{P_s} \times \frac{PCI_c}{PCI_s}}$$

Where:

TAC_c = trade area capture by city,
 RS_c = retail sales by city,
 RS_s = retail sales for the state,
 P_s = state population,
 PCI_c = per capita income by county, and
 PCI_s = per capita income for the state.

Trade area capture figures incorporate both income and expenditure factors, which may be influencing retail trade trends. An underlying assumption of the trade area capture estimate is that local tastes and preferences are similar to that of the state as a whole. If a trade area capture estimate is larger than city population then two explanations are possible: 1) the city is attracting customers outside its boundaries, or 2) residents of the city are spending more than the state average.

Trade area capture figures can be utilized to estimate the amount of sales going to outside consumers. To do this, a pull factor, which is a measure of an economy's retail sales gap, is derived using trade area capture figures and city population:

$$PF_c = \frac{TAC_c}{P_c}$$

Where:

PF_c = city pull factor, and
 P_c = city population.

A pull factor of 1.0 means the city is drawing all its customers from within its boundaries but none from the outside. A pull factor of 1.50 means the city is drawing non-local customers equal to 50 percent of the city population. A pull factor of less than one means the city is not capturing the shoppers within its boundaries or they are spending relatively less than the state average. This is considered a leakage of retail sales or a retail sales gap. Additional discussion of trade area capture and pull factors can be found in the references cited in this report (Barta and Woods; Harris; Stone and McConnon; Hustedde, Shatter, and Pulver). The Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service has been conducting pull factor/gap analysis and sales tax analysis since 1991 (Woods, 1991).

City pull factors and trade area capture figures are calculated for fiscal years 1980 through 2010. Data used were sales tax returns as reported by the Oklahoma Tax Commission. These figures include only taxable sales in an area, but they provide a proxy for all retail sales. Population data were obtained from the Oklahoma Department of Commerce and are consistent with figures from the 1980, 1990, 2000, and 2010 Census. Income figures were taken from the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) estimates for counties. Similar income data for cities were not available, so county income was used as a proxy.

IMPORTANT: Readers should note that BEA continually updates its estimates—sometimes for all years back to 1969, which was the case with a recently released data set. These updates affect the values for trade area capture and pull factors. Because of this, trade area capture and pull factor values in this report may differ slightly from values previously published in older versions of this report.

TAXABLE SALES ANALYSIS

Sales tax returns as reported by the Oklahoma Tax Commission for Shawnee are listed in Table 1 for the fiscal years 1980 to 2010. Sales tax returns are important to a city because they reflect the general health of a local economy and also represent significant revenue for the city budget. In FY 2010, Shawnee collected nearly \$15.4 million in sales tax at a tax rate of 3.0%. This translates into over \$512 million in retail sales. This is a decrease from 2009, when Shawnee collected nearly \$16 million in sales tax collections at the same rate or more than over \$531 million in retail sales. This is a common trend across the state for retail sales in FY2010. Sales are estimated from the sales tax returns and the sales tax rate that is reported. Figure 1 plots estimated taxable sales in both actual dollars and inflation-adjusted dollars. The Consumer Price Index is used to adjust for inflation. When taxable sales have been adjusted for inflation, Figure 1 shows that “real” sales have increased overall since 1980. Real sales did experience a slight decline from 2009 to 2010; however, the decline is not as significant as the one in nominal dollars.

Table 2 lists trade area capture figures for Shawnee from 1980 to 2010. Shawnee’s trade area capture has ranged from 35,952 in 1981 to 55,770 in 2010. This means that in 2010 Shawnee “captured” the retail sales of 55,770 persons. This is an increase from 2009 when Shawnee captured 51,775 shoppers. Even though Shawnee did experience a decline in retail sales, it was not as significant as the rest of the state. Therefore, this will boost Shawnee’s TAC. Figure 2 presents a graphic of these same trade area capture figures. Table 2 also displays population figures for Shawnee from 1980 to 2010. Shawnee’s population has increased overall since 1980. However, the 2010 Census population appears to be slightly lower than the estimates projected in previous years. Shawnee’s 2010 Census population is 29,857.

Table 3 lists pull factors for Shawnee for the years 1980 to 2010. The pull factor for Shawnee ranges from 1.332 in 1981 to 1.915 in 1997. Shawnee's pull factor is currently 1.868. The interpretation is that Shawnee is capturing shoppers equal to 1.868 times the local population. Similar to the TAC, this is an increase for Shawnee. In addition to state sales decreasing at a larger rate, Shawnee's population had a slight decline of 679 people. Both of these factors can raise a pull factor, even with a decline in retail sales from the previous year.

Table 3 also shows pull factors for cities and towns in Pottawatomie County with a reported sales tax. Figure 3 plots these pull factors. Following Shawnee, Earlsboro posts the next highest pull factor of 0.630. This is a decline from 2009 when Earlsboro posted a pull factor of 1.465. Tecumseh follows with a pull factor of 0.463. This is the highest pull factor Tecumseh has experienced since 2003. Asher, Maud, and McLoud follow closely with current pull factors of 0.391, 0.376 and 0.355, respectively. These three communities have experienced an increase since 2009. Wanette follows with a current pull factor of 0.234. Similar to Tecumseh, this is the largest pull factor Wanette has posted since 2003. Pink has a current pull factor of 0.054. This is the largest pull factor Pink has posted since they started collecting a sales tax in 2008.


Figure 4 shows pull factors for 460+ cities that have sales tax return information available. The pull factors are presented as a group average by city size. The highest pull factors fall in the size categories 10,001 to 25,000 and 25,001 to 50,000 in population with the category of 5,000-10,000 close behind. The smallest pull factors fall in the range for cities less than 1,000 in population. Figure 5 plots Shawnee's pull factor compared to other cities with population of 25,000-50,000. Shawnee has consistently posted higher pull factors than the average of cities of similar size.







Figure 3. Pull Factors for Cities and Towns in Pottawatomie County, FY 1980-2010





SALES GAP ANALYSIS FOR SHAWNEE, OK

For purposes of this study, a sales gap analysis refers to a pull factor study that has been analyzed by SIC code for the 8 retail sectors. Sales gap coefficients may be interpreted in exactly the same manner as are pull factors. Gap coefficients and trade area capture values will also vary from previous years due to updated BEA and Census data. See Table 4 for Shawnee's sales gap analysis. Table 5 provides a detailed description of the 8 retail SIC categories.

For Shawnee's Building and Gardening Materials (SIC 52), the number of shoppers has increased overall since 2006 with a significant increase from 2009. The highest TAC was recorded in 2005 with 76,322 shoppers. Shawnee's current gap coefficient is 2.364 (see bottom half of Table 4). Therefore, in 2010, this sector captured the sales of a population equal to 2.364 times the local population.

The category of General Merchandise (SIC 53) tends to be dominated by Wal-Mart. Wal-Mart reports all its sales under this category (even though it sells clothing, grocery items, etc. as well). In general, towns that have a Wal-Mart (especially a Wal-Mart Supercenter) will post sales gap coefficients that are greater than 1.0 for this category, and those that do not have a Wal-Mart will post sales gap coefficients that are less than 1.0. This trend does hold true in Shawnee. Shawnee does have a Wal-Mart Supercenter. Moreover, their gap coefficient for this sector has been consistently above 2.5 for the years displayed. Shawnee's current gap coefficient for this sector is 2.797 which translates into 83,508 shoppers for FY 2010. This is an increase from 2009 when Shawnee posted a gap coefficient of 2.523.

Grocery stores (SIC 54) in Shawnee had a gap coefficient of 1.054 in 2010. Consumers tend to appreciate the convenience of shopping for groceries close to home; consequently, it is typical to find that even very small towns post high gap coefficients (over 1.0) for this sector. However, as stated earlier, Shawnee does have a Wal-Mart Supercenter that likely attracts many grocery shoppers.

Therefore, for the stores in Shawnee that solely sell groceries, they are attracting a population that is 1.054 times their local population.

SIC category 55 is difficult to interpret because motor vehicle and gasoline sales are exempt from municipal sales tax in Oklahoma. Most of the sales tax collection reported under this category appears to stem from auto parts stores and other retail sales from gas stations. For instance, most gas stations sell snack items, tires, some auto parts, oil, anti-freeze, etc. Sales tax collections for Shawnee in this category indicate that these types of businesses attracted a number of shoppers equal to about 2.053 times the local population. This is the highest gap coefficient posted in this sector for the years displayed. It also helps that Shawnee is located on Interstate 40.

Apparel sales are reported under SIC 56. Many small towns have nearly zero sales in this category, and it is common to see sales gap coefficients that are less than 0.10 in these towns. Cities with large malls tend to be the most successful at capturing the market. Shawnee does have a mall, and at the same time, posts significantly large sales gap coefficients for this sector. In 2010, Shawnee reported a sales gap coefficient of 2.915 for this sector. This is the largest gap coefficient for this sector for the years displayed. Shawnee has had a consistent upward trend of clothing sales since 2006.

SIC 57 reports Furniture and Home Furnishings. Also included are appliance and electronics stores, drapery and floor covering stores, and music stores. This category is often viewed from the perspective that many furniture purchases are made in either Tulsa or Oklahoma City. Oklahoma City, for example, has a large cluster of retail furniture stores centralized in one geographic area. Even though Shawnee is located in close proximity to Oklahoma City, they still post high gap coefficients in this sector. In 2010, Shawnee posted a gap coefficient of 1.724. This is a significant increase from 2009.

Eating and Drinking Places, SIC 58, is one of the most straightforward retail sectors. It contains restaurants and bars. Restaurants and bars in Shawnee captured 67,107 customers in FY 2010. Restaurants in Shawnee tend to attract a number of shoppers that is equal to about 2.248 times the town's population. The sales gap coefficient for this sector has increased overall since 2006.

SIC 59, or Miscellaneous Retail, contains a host of retail activity, including pharmacies, florists, liquor stores, and antique stores. These are often the downtown or "Main Street" merchants. In 2010, Shawnee attracted 48,168 shoppers in this category for a gap coefficient of 1.613. This sector has remained around the 1.50 mark since 2005.

BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT STRATEGIES

Retail trade trends reflect the overall health of a local economy. All out shopping or sales leakage cannot be stopped. Often, larger economic trends (State-National-Global) overwhelm retail opportunities. There are programs and actions that can assist retail trade activities, however.

Concerned leaders and business persons can focus on business development by forming a business assistance committee to begin implementing some of the assistance activities or working with the existing chamber of commerce. The following activities are part of a retail trade improvement program. These activities can improve the climate for business and show the community's commitment to support local business.

1. Analyze the local business sector to identify needs and opportunities to be pursued by the program. Businesses often do not have the resources to study the economy (local, regional, and national) and how they fit in. They need practical data and analysis that will help in their individual business decision-making. In particular, economic analysis can identify voids in the local or regional market that can possibly be filled by expanding or new businesses. Examples of analysis include the pull factor analysis reported here, threshold analysis, and consumer surveys to identify needs and opportunities.

In addition to economic analysis, information is needed on the needs or problems of individual businesses and of the business district as a whole. As needs are identified, action can be taken to improve the situation. For example, a business may need help in preparing a business plan to qualify for financing. Perhaps the appearance of buildings and vacant lots is detrimental to attracting people to the business district, or perhaps poorly coordinated store hours are a hindrance. Once these needs are identified, a business development

program can initiate action. A periodic survey of local business needs can form the basis of a business development program's work plan.

2. Provide management assistance and counseling to improve the efficiency and profitability of local businesses. Many local businesses are owner-operated, earn low profits, and have difficulty in obtaining financing. Businessmen often need additional education and training in improving business management skills like accounting, finance, planning, marketing, customer relations, merchandising, personnel management, or tax procedures. This assistance and counseling can be provided through seminars and one-to-one aid. Sources of assistance include the Service Corps of Retired Executives (SCORE), Small Business Development Center programs sponsored by the Small Business Administration, universities, technology centers, Oklahoma Department of Commerce, and the Cooperative Extension Service. The intent is to aid small businesses in becoming more competitive.
3. Assist new business start-up and entrepreneurial activity by analyzing potential markets and local skills and matching entrepreneurs with technical and financial resources. Establishing a business incubator is another way to assist new businesses. An incubator is a building with shed space or service requirements that reduce start-up costs for new businesses. Incubators have been successful in many locations but are not the right answer for every town. A successful incubator must have long-range planning, specific goals, and good management in order to identify markets and entrepreneurs.
4. Promote the development of home-based enterprises. Home-based work by individuals is increasing because of the flexibility offered and because in some areas, it may be the most realistic alternative. Home-based enterprises can include a great variety of full or part-time occupations such as food processing, quilting, weaving, crafts, clothing assembly, mail order processing, or assembling various goods.

5. Provide assistance in identifying and obtaining financing. Small businesses often have difficulty obtaining long-term bank financing for expansion because they lack assets to mortgage, cannot obtain affordable terms or rates, or cannot present a strong business plan. A business development program can identify public loan programs and package them with private loans to make projects feasible.

6. Provide assistance in undertaking joint projects such as:

- improved appearance;
- improved management of the commercial area;
- building renovation;
- preparation of design standards;
- joint promotions and marketing;
- organizing independent merchants;
- special activities and events;
- fund raising;
- improved customer relations;
- uniform hours of operation.

Undertaking these projects requires cooperation, good organization, and efficient management. These projects can improve a business district's competitive position and attract new customers. The Oklahoma Main Street Program provides many good examples of towns working together for economic revitalization. The Main Street Program, developed by the National Trust for Historic Preservation, is built around the four points of organization, design, promotion, and economic restructuring.

7. Develop a one-stop permit center. There is great deal of red tape involved in starting a business including registering a name, choosing a legal form, and determining what licenses,

permits, or bonds are needed. Other concerns include internal revenue service requirements, unemployment insurance, sales tax permits, and state withholding taxes. Having this type of information available in one location will make life easier for potential businesses.

8. Involve active organizations and the media. Groups such as the chamber of commerce, civic clubs, etc. can encourage a healthy business climate. The local media can also support small business and aid in developing awareness of the importance of local business.

SUMMARY

This report has presented an analysis of taxable sales trends for the city of Shawnee and Pottawatomie County. The level of taxable sales in Shawnee has significantly increased in nominal terms since 1980. After correcting for inflation, taxable sales have increased overall since 1980. However, retail sales in FY 2010 did decrease in both real and nominal terms for Shawnee. However, the real sales decrease was not as significant as nominal sales. This is a trend that was not only present in Shawnee, but also in Oklahoma and the rest of the nation. Shawnee's decline in retail sales was not as significant as the rest of the state; therefore, Shawnee experienced an increase in their trade area capture and pull factor. The increase in their pull factor was partly due to the large decrease in state sales, but they also experienced a slight decline from their 2009 population estimates to their 2010 Census count. These, coupled effects had a positive impact on their pull factor.

When examining the sector-level gap coefficients, Shawnee experienced an increase in every sector. The most surprising increases came in furniture and home furnishings (SIC 57) and apparel and accessory stores (SIC 56). These two sectors typically tend to be dominated by the metro areas. However, Shawnee attracted nearly 3 times their local population to apparel and clothing stores, and over 1.7 times their population to their furniture stores. Shawnee attracted well over double their population in every sector except grocery stores (SIC 54), furniture and home furnishings (SIC 57) and miscellaneous retail (SIC 59). As stated earlier, state sales experienced a significant decline in FY 2010. It is also possible that shoppers stayed closer to home. Either way, Shawnee experienced increases.

While Shawnee does attract many shoppers and continues to increase, it is important to still focus on the possibility of out-shopping to larger areas. In particular, Shawnee is located on Interstate 40, which puts them within minutes of the Oklahoma City metro area.

Shawnee is located in Pottawatomie County, Oklahoma, United States. The population is 28,692 at the 2000 census. The city is the county seat of Pottawatomie county and part of the Micropolitan Statistical Area. Trade area is in excess of 300,000 people.

Located on Interstate 40, Shawnee is just 30 minutes east of downtown Oklahoma City attractions. To the east and northeast, the McClellan-Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System offers barge access to the Gulf of Mexico and the Great Lakes Region. The Shawnee Regional Airport features a 5,650 foot precision approach pilot controlled runway and an Instrument Landing System (ILS, GS/LOC, PAPI, GPS).

They receive a Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Grant from the Emergency Management Division of the Department of Homeland Security. This is usually for \$2,400/year. We also receive \$1,000/year to distribute SARA 312 reports to the various Pottawatomie County Fire Departments. This is a service we provide on behalf of the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality.

Initially, the LEPC was established, by the EPA, to develop hazardous materials emergency preparedness plans, and to train on these plans. Our mission has expanded to include public awareness training and emergency response planning for mass immunizations, natural disasters, and other emergency response type scenarios.

The City of Shawnee utilizes surface water from the Twin Lakes and Wes Watkins Reservoir

The community has four elevated towers in town with a maximum capacity of 2.5 MG (million gallons). Average daily consumption will range from 3 MGD (Million gallons per day) during low usage times to 7 MGD during peak Demands in the dry summer months.

The Water Treatment Plant currently has a capacity of 8 MGD. The pressure in the mains will range from 50 PSI to 80 PSI.

The City has two wastewater treatment facilities. One is an extended aeration plant and the other is a trickling filter plant. Both were designed for 3 MGD and currently average approximately half of that usage now.

The City has recently completed over \$9 million dollars' worth of extensive infrastructure improvements to the water supply delivery system.

Educational Resources: (Shawnee and schools within a ten mile radius)

The greater Shawnee area offers a well-rounded program of education. In addition to an excellent public school system, the community offers two private schools, two universities, technical training, six preschool facilities, and care and training for the physically and mentally handicapped.

Seven other colleges and universities, including the University of Oklahoma and Oklahoma State University are located within sixty miles of our community.

Shawnee Public Schools

Shawnee Public School District is the largest and most comprehensive school district in Pottawatomie County. It is comprised of five elementary schools, a middle school, a high school and an alternative school. Shawnee voters passed over 10 million dollars in bond issues in the last four years for improvements in educational facilities. These improvements include a new \$9 million "state of the art" Middle School, \$1.4 million on new sports facilities and \$475,000 on elementary remodeling projects.

The Shawnee High School boasts over \$1,000,000 each year in scholarship money to seniors and thirteen National Merit or Commended Scholars in the last six years. Convenient access to concurrent classes is available at both Oklahoma Baptist University and St. Gregory's University. Academic Bowl Teams consistently rank with the best five-A teams in the state.

Oklahoma Baptist University

A four-year accredited university offering more than 80 areas of study. It was ranked second among baccalaureate colleges in the western region in the 2011 *U.S. News & World Report* "America's Best Colleges" ratings. OBU is Oklahoma's top-ranked university in the Forbes.com 2011 listing of "America's Best Colleges" and named a 2011 "Best in the West" institution by The Princeton Review.

Shawnee Resources

St. Gregory's University

St. Gregory's is one of Oklahoma's oldest private colleges. A four-year accredited university with an outstanding record of preparing students to further their education.

Gordon Cooper Technology Center

GCTC is dedicated to developing a relationship of integrity and value with its industrial community. Their mission is to ensure that each business and industry in its district succeeds. The Gordon Cooper Technology Center main campus is located in Shawnee. Gordon Cooper Career Tech is home to a satellite branch of the Oklahoma State School of Science and Mathematics, *along with the John C. Moving to a new city can be one of the most exciting chapters in our life. But, for parents of school age children, moving to an unfamiliar place can add an extra challenge — finding accurate information about quality educational choices for your children.

We have compiled information for all educational institutions in the Shawnee area. On these pages you will find institutions on the move, changing rapidly to fit the needs of 21st century students.

In 2005, Shawnee residents passed a school bond issue providing \$18 million in capital improvements. This resulted in the construction of an early childhood center to provide a developmentally

appropriate academic program for four and five-year-olds, a \$10 million athletic building and a performing arts center. Since then, \$3 million in bonds has paid for renovations to Shawnee High School and Jim Thorpe Stadium.

Gordon Cooper Technology Center recently finished an Aviation Maintenance facility which houses a certified aviation mechanics program. Graduates of this program are in demand at Tinker Air Force Base, just 20 minutes from Shawnee.

Oklahoma Baptist University recently added a Recreation and Wellness Center to its campus. The \$14 million center includes three full-sized basketball courts, a climbing wall and state of the art workout equipment. In

addition, a new outdoor track facility and baseball and softball complexes were constructed.

St. Gregory's University, established in 1875, is the only Catholic university in the state. In the future, SGU plans to move forward on a \$10 million project for new residence halls.

ABSTRACT

The goal of this paper is to provide a threshold analysis for Shawnee. Threshold analysis attempts to estimate how many stores of various types a community can support. The estimate is based on the community's population and average number of persons per business in Oklahoma.

THRESHOLD ANALYSIS FOR SHAWNEE, OK

Introduction to Threshold Analysis

Most people know that a town's population must reach a certain level before a McDonald's will locate in that community. McDonald's marketing specialists are using a technique referred to as *threshold analysis* to make these decisions. The concept is simple. The restaurant needs a sizeable market to be profitable.

If this kind of analysis works for fast food restaurants, it stands to reason that it would apply to other kinds of businesses as well. Next time you drive through a small town, take a look at the business mix. You'll probably notice that even a small town of 3,000 people has 5 or 6 beauty or barber shops, 1 or 2 florists, a small grocery store and a couple of antique shops. The small town probably won't have a furniture store, a shoe store, or a music/CD store. To be successful, different kinds of businesses need to have different sized markets. Beauty shops don't require large market areas, but music stores do.

Dr. Kenneth Stone is a professor of economics and an Extension economist at Iowa State University, and he has worked for many years in the field of retail trade and community development. Stone, along with his colleague Georgeanne Artz, has developed a fairly simple way to estimate how large a market needs to be for various types of retail establishments. They refer to this minimum market size as the *threshold level*. Stone and Artz define the threshold level for a type of business as: the average number of people in the state per business.

For example, in 2008 Oklahoma's population equaled 3,644,025, and according to the 2008 County Business Patterns and Nonemployer Statistics, there were 1,303 grocery

stores. Thus, in 2008 there were 2,797 people per grocery store in Oklahoma; this is the threshold level for grocery stores in Oklahoma.

Using threshold levels as a general guide, it is possible to predict how many businesses of a certain type a community might support. Small towns can generally support several restaurants, which have a threshold between 992 and 1,183. Shoe stores, on the other hand, require a much larger market of about 11,950.

Using Census data and the threshold level methodology developed by Stone and Artz, this paper will estimate the number of establishments that Shawnee could reasonably expect to support. These estimates should be viewed as guidelines only, and **the authors make no recommendations concerning the use of these estimates.**

Because the threshold values are based upon state-level data, they are best interpreted as averages. Some communities will be able to sustain more businesses than our analysis reports, while other communities will not be able to sustain the number of business generated in our analysis. Many factors contribute to the success of businesses locally, such as managerial skill of the business owner, local economic development initiatives (e.g., Main Street programs), and sales tax differentials between jurisdictions. Proximity to other communities, commuting patterns and access to highways can also impact the number of businesses a community can sustain. Therefore, the numbers contained in this report are meant to be “conversation starters” – they must be contextualized to the local community based upon more detailed knowledge available to local leaders but not available to the researchers. Several sources of the actual number of businesses in Shawnee include: retail sales tax permit holder listings, a web search, telephone book listings, Chamber of Commerce membership directory, or marketing lists that can be purchased from a number of companies.

Methodology

The data requirements for conducting a threshold analysis for Shawnee, OK include: Shawnee's current population and the threshold levels for various kinds of establishments. Current population estimates from the Oklahoma Department of Commerce's Census Data Center indicate that Shawnee has a population of 30,171 in 2008.

Thresholds for the state of Oklahoma have been constructed following the Stone and Artz methodology. The state population estimate was taken from the Oklahoma Department of Commerce's "2000-2009 Oklahoma Incorporated Places Population Estimates and Growth by Place by County" for 2008, to match the use of the 2008 County Business Patterns and Nonemployer Statistics number of establishments data (the most recent available). (Nonemployer Statistics captures the number of self-employed persons in Shawnee by industrial sector.) By dividing the population estimate for Shawnee by the derived, state-level thresholds, one can estimate the number of businesses the community should be able to sustain on average. Definitions of the North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS) codes are available at the sector level (2-digits) in Table 3, or more detailed definitions are available from the US Census Bureau at <http://www.census.gov/eos/www/naics/>.

Results for Shawnee, OK

Table 1 presents the threshold analysis results for Shawnee. For example, the threshold level for fast-food restaurants (a.k.a, NAICS 7222: Limited-Service Eating Places) is 992 persons. The 2008 population of Shawnee is 30,171; thus it is estimated that this city may be able to support as many as 30 fast-food restaurants (30,171 divided by 992).

Generalizing, it is believed that Shawnee could support somewhere in the range of 26-56 restaurants (fast-food and full-service restaurants combined). Shawnee could also probably support 111 beauty salons and barber shops (NAICS 8121) and 60 child day care facilities (NAICS 6244). Shawnee could probably support 49 accountants and/or tax preparers (NAICS 5412), 24 drug stores (NAICS 4461), and eleven grocery store (NAICS 4451). Shawnee may or may not have enough population to support a department store (NAICS 4521), but it may or may not have enough population to support charter bus service (NAICS 4855).

According to Stone and Artz, threshold levels should be used as a general guide in determining how many businesses a town can support. They remind, however, that there are always exceptions to any rule. A highly successful watch, clock, and jewelry repair store may be located in a town of 2,500, but, in general, stores that “buck the trend” in this way are usually well-established, well-operated, and have usually been around for a long time. Similarly, a community may not be able to sustain the number of businesses reported here due to individual mismanagement or other factors (e.g., recent loss of a major employer). In the case of Shawnee, particular concern for the presence of significant competition from retailers and service providers in Oklahoma City, OK should be taken into account. These numbers are best used as guidelines in developing locally-driven economic development goals.
